Peter Pan Playgroup What To Do In Case of Fire Policy

It is important that all adults and children know what to do in the case of a fire on the premises, to be able to act calmly, and exit the premises as soon as possible.

The person who discovers a fire should:

- 1. Ring the fire bell breaking the glass if necessary or blow the whistle.
- 2. On hearing the bell or whistle:

EVERYONE WILL STOP WHAT THEY ARE DOING

STAND STILL, STOP TALKING AND LISTEN

- 3. The Manager/Supervisor will tell the children to move towards the door and line up. Staff will lead the children outside and group together, **keeping the children calm**.
- 4. All staff will leave the building with the children and assemble at a safe distance from the building in the outside garden.
- 5. The Manager/Supervisor will be the last one to leave the building, ensuring that no one is left in the toilets, kitchen or elsewhere.
- 6. The Manager/Supervisor will collect the register and first aid box and contact the Fire Brigade.
- 7. The register will be taken, including all visitors.
- 8. No one will re-enter the building until it has been declared safe to do so.

Fire Drill

A fire drill will take place at least once each half term and will follow the same procedures as outlined above, as if there was an actual fire.

A record will be kept of the date and time of all fire drills.
